Investment Objective & Policy

The Fund aims to achieve long term capital appreciation. The Fund invests primarily in securities issued by companies with either assets in, or revenues derived from the People's Republic of China that are listed, traded or dealt in on Regulated Markets in China, Hong Kong, Taiwan, the US or in a member state of the OECD.

Manager's comments

- The MSCI China Index closed higher in April, led up by property, materials and industrials.
- China bucked the trend of generally weaker global markets to close higher on renewed expectations of policy loosening.
- Inflation in China picked up again, rising to 3.6% in March compared with 3.2% in February.
- We sold China Resources Cement on expectations of weakening demand in China, and Luk Fook Holdings on concerns over peaking growth.
- We prefer companies with visible earnings growth and proven management track records.
- The Fund has large positions in companies like Yantai Changyu and China Communications Services, which we expect will have relatively defensive domestically driven earnings.
- In the longer term, China will continue to grow its domestic economy and level of urbanisation, benefiting ENN Energy and China Resources Power.
- We will reduce cyclical stocks that have rallied to less attractive valuations.

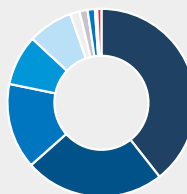
