The Fund aims to achieve long-term capital growth. The Fund invests in a diversified portfolio of securities of issuers established or having significant operations in emerging economies and listed, traded or dealt in on regulated markets worldwide. The investment process will take account of sustainability themes and issues and requires positive engagement with companies in respect of these.

Manager's comments

- Emerging markets fell in April with global markets as concerns about the sovereign debt crisis in the Eurozone resurfaced.
- Emerging Asia held up the best, while Latin America underperformed on Brazilian weakness.
- At a sector level, the Consumer sectors and Telecom Services outperformed while Energy and Materials lagged.
- We bought Unilever, a leader in providing affordable good quality staples to low income households in emerging markets.
- We sold Comgas (Brazil: Utilities) on concerns about the prospect of changes in the controlling group.
- The best quality companies in emerging markets look close to fully valued.
- This only increases our focus on companies with conservative debt levels, predictable earnings and steady cash flows.
- High quality Consumer Staples companies are expensive at present and we see much more attractive valuations in Developed Market parent companies.
- The Fund has significant holdings in companies with exposure to clean energy and energy efficiency, areas where we see very strong growth prospects.

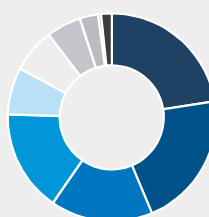

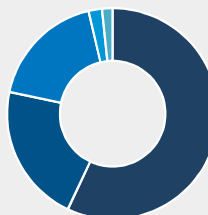
